Elon Musk is an American entrepreneur who has made a significant impact on the world in various fields, including technology, aerospace, and transportation. He is recognized by his high intelligence that helps him succeed in making new creations.

Musk's journey began in Pretoria city in South Africa, where he was born on June 28, 1971. He showed an early interest in computers and technology and learned how to program at the age of twelve. At the age of seventeen, he moved to Canada to study physics and economics at Queen's University. He transferred later to the University of Pennsylvania, where he earned bachelor's degrees in both fields. After graduating, Musk moved to California to earn a doctorate degree in applied physics at Stanford University. However, he dropped out after just two days to start his own businesses.

His first successful business was Zip2, a company that provides maps and business directories to online newspapers. He sold Zip2 to Compaq Computers in 1999 for 307 million dollars. Musk's next business was forming PayPal. PayPal has become a very successful online payment platform, and Musk was its CEO until 2002. In that same year, Musk founded SpaceX, a company with the ambitious goal of making space travel cheaper and accessible to everyone. SpaceX has succeeded in developing reusable rockets and launching cargo to the International Space Station.

In 2004, Musk started investing in Tesla, an electric car company that was founded earlier in 2003. He became Tesla's CEO in 2008. Under his leadership, the company has become the world's leading manufacturer of electric vehicles. Tesla's cars are known for their beautiful design and advanced technology.

Musk's vision extends far beyond electric cars and space travel. He is the co-founder of OpenAI and Neuralink companies, which aim at producing safe technologies for humanity. OpenAI researches the use of artificial intelligence (AI) to develop machine learning, while Neuralink develops brain-machine interfaces (BMIs) that enable human interaction with machines. Also, Musk has been a strong supporter of education that he has donated millions of dollars to several educational institutions.

I hope you're having a great day. I'm writing to tell you about the history of Snapchat and share some interesting facts about it as one of the most popular social media apps in the world. I know you like using it like me, so I thought you would love to know how it developed.

Snapchat was created in 2011 by the friends, Evan Spiegel, Bobby Murphy, and Reggie Brown when they were students at Stanford University. Their idea was to create a platform where photos and messages could disappear after a short time, making it more private. At first, it was called 'Picaboo'. Later, they renamed it as Snapchat. The name 'Snapchat' originally came from the words: 'snap' and 'chat', combining the idea of quick and casual communication.

Snapchat quickly gained popularity, especially among young people. By 2012, users were sending thousands of snaps every day, and Snapchat was processing around 25 images per second. By 2013, that number had grown to 4,500 per second.

One of the things that made Snapchat unique was its 'Stories' feature. This allows users to share a series of moments that would disappear in 24 hours. Later, Snapchat introduced the 'Discover' feature in 2015. Discover allows users to access content from various publishers, and to add fun filters and lenses to swap faces, and even change their voices. Also, the 'Snap Map' was introduced in 2017 to enable users to see the locations and activities of their friends.

While searching, I've gathered some interesting facts about Snapchat that would amaze you. Do you know that Snapchat has over 347 million daily active users, most of them are between the ages of 18 and 24! About 63% of Snapchat users open the app every day. Did you know that 61% of the users are females? Over four billion snaps (photos) are shared around the world every day. Snapchat's daily views of video have increased by 400% since it started.

Overall, Snapchat is an innovative social media app that is constantly developing. It is a great platform to stay connected with friends and family and I thought that it was the top one used app. To my surprise, I discovered that it comes in the ninth place. Guess which app comes first? It is Facebook, so my next search will be about Facebook, which is your favourite platform.

Climate change refers to long-term changes in temperature and weather patterns on Earth. It is mainly caused by human activities that release large amounts of greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. This change does not only affect humans but also has great impacts on different animals like turtles.

For instance, the impacts of climate change severely harm sea turtles, which lay their eggs on beaches. Due to rising sea levels, these beaches are disappearing. This means that sea turtles are losing their nesting places.

Generally, sea turtles need an average temperature of 29 degrees celsius to help eggs hatch safely, and to have equal numbers of male and female turtles. However, the increasing temperature of nesting beaches is affecting gender diversity; cooler sand produces male turtles, while warmer sand produces females. With rising temperatures, scientists predict that there will be more female turtles than males. To solve this issue, scientists at Junquillal Beach built nurseries with cooler temperature to help them grow in equal numbers.

Hot ocean temperatures also have a negative impact on the coral reefs, which are an important food source for sea turtles. Rising sea temperatures have caused coral reefs to bleach, which leads to the death of parts of the corals. This has affected the Caribbean Sea, which has already lost almost 50% of its corals since 2005, because of the high sea temperatures.

To face these challenges, governments started searching for solutions. One effective solution is using renewable energy like solar and wind powers, which can slow down the rate of climate change and reduce its impact on turtle habitats. That is because it reduces the amount of greenhouse gases released into the atmosphere.

Another solution for protecting turtles is creating Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) for sea turtles. These are closed areas where sea turtles can grow and nest safely. It is a way of protecting the turtles' natural habitats.

To end, turtles are not alone in facing the challenges of climate change. Many other animals, from polar bears in the Arctic to coral reefs in the ocean, are also feeling the great impacts of changing climate. It's a global issue that affects various ecosystems and species. People and governments need to work together to protect these animals and their natural habitats to keep the balance of nature.

Air pollution is one of the most serious problems facing the world today. When something is burned, bad chemicals in the smoke can go into the air. These bad chemicals cause problems like global warming and acid rain. There are many causes of air pollution, but the major one is cars which emit tones of pollution into the air every day. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) estimates that cars cause nearly 75% of the carbon pollution in the US.

In fact, most people with cars say they need their cars, and they cannot live without them. For example, the US is a car-loving country. The average number of cars needed is two cars per a family. It was reported, in 2020, there were 11.3 million cars just in New York city.

As a result, rather than asking people to stop driving, a better idea might be to make something that people can use instead of cars. This new thing should not pollute the air. That is why Dean Kamen invented the Segway in 1999 in the US. This Segway has two wheels, a place for the driver to stand on and a handle for the driver to hold on to. Driving a Segway is very different from driving a car. Instead of stepping on a paddle to go forward, the driver simply leans forward. Leaning back slows it down. To turn left, the driver simply leans left. It depends on body movement. It is super easy but needs practice at the beginning to avoid accidents.

The main benefit of Segway is that it does not burn gasoline. It runs on electricity. Moreover, it is suitable for short distances in crowded cities. For example, the UAE government tried many projects to reduce the country carbon footprint such as providing Segways in Dubai. In fact, there are 2.000 Segways available for rent in the city. To unlock the Segway, you have to pay only 3 Emirati Dirhams.

Unfortunately, the Segway will not replace the cars because most people using their cars to drive long distances to work. They live outside of cities and drive into the city every day. You cannot drive the Segway that far because it goes too slowly. It can go to only about 20 kilometers per hour.

To sum up, Segways have been sold since 2001. Nowadays, they are relatively new and quite expensive. However, they can make a big difference because they are ecofriendly and quiet too. Perhaps, in time, they will become cheaper, and everyone will have a Segway for short distance travelling. Changing small habits can play a big role in saving the environment.

### **The Compressed Air Car**

As gas and petrol prices continue to rise in the world, many people think that there are other alternatives to these fossil fuels. Tesla, which is an electric car, appeared in 2003 to be one of the solutions for improving emissions, reducing energy costs, and having a clean environment. Nowadays, there is another need to produce a new type of cars called the compressed air cars.

The compressed air car will be designed to produce zero-emissions, so the main benefit of this type of cars is that it produces no pollution from its tailpipes because there is no fuel being burned by the engine. Moreover, this car can cost only \$ 2 compared with \$ 6 to refill an electric car tank. Because of less pollution and cheaper running costs, the compressed air car seems like a real possibility for the future.

In addition, the compressed air cars will be designed to be very lightweight, so they will be able to travel for long distances with less energy. Filling the tank will not be costly because the air will be the main fuel of this car.

On the other hand, the compressed air car has a lot of potential benefits, it has many drawbacks. First, the compressed air car can only drive at a speed of about 56 Kilometres per hour, which is simply not fast enough for most consumers who need at least 100 kilometres per hour. Also, there is a problem of refilling the tanks because the compressor needs a type of fuel source, whether it is fossil fuels, hydrogen, or an electric motor. So, this means that pollution might occur.

Making the compressed air cars is a great idea, but they will not work efficiently nowadays like fully electric cars, hybrid cars and normal engine cars. People need to drive cars with high performance and suitable speed. However, *Zero Pollution Motors* has succeeded to manufacture the AIRPod 2.0 Compressed Air-Powered Car. It seems to be the most famous compressed air car on the market. With a price of just over \$10,000, the AIRPod could be cheaper than some fully electric cars. The AIRPod is able to achieve city speeds of about 32-48 kilometres per hour with a range of around 160 kilometres per compressed air tank. While you can charge your electric car in your house in four hours, you can take the AIRPod car to a gas station to refill it in three minutes only.

I am writing to publish my article in our school magazine. The article is about an interesting project called the 'Plastiki', which has been already carried out in the United States. I collected the information by conducting an online meeting with the person responsible for the project.

The *Plastiki* looks like many other boats or yachts in Sydney harbour in Australia. It's eighteen metres long, six metres wide and it weighs about twelve thousand kilogrammes. It carries a crew of six people and has an average speed of five knots. However, once you get near to the *Plastiki* you realise there's a big difference. It's made of twelve thousand five hundred plastic bottles.

One day, the environmentalist David Rothschild was reading some information about all the plastic in the seas and oceans. He couldn't believe what he was reading. For example, humans throw away four out of every five plastic bottles they use and plastic rubbish causes about eighty per cent of the pollution in the sea. Rothschild decided to fight against pollution in the sea. So, He started building a boat made of plastic bottles to educate people about plastic pollution

Recycled plastic was used to build the environmentally friendly boat. It uses renewable energy sources including wind power and solar energy. The crew can make meals with vegetables from the small garden at the back of the boat. They can take a break from work and get some exercise by using the special exercise bicycle. The energy from the bike provides power for the boat's computers. And if anyone needs to take a shower, the boat's shower uses saltwater from the sea.

Rothschild sailed the *Plastiki* across the Pacific Ocean from San Francisco to Sydney. That's 15,372 nautical kilometres. Rothschild took the boat through the 'Great Garbage Patch'. It is a huge area in the Pacific with 3.5 billion kilogrammes of rubbish. The journey wasn't always easy, and Rothschild and his crew had to take care during storms. There were giant ocean waves and winds of over one hundred kilometres per hour. The whole journey took one hundred and twenty-nine days.

In a room at Stanford University, scientists are studying a small animal called a gecko. It's an amazing animal because it can move very quickly up and down a tree and it can even walk upside down on ceilings. The scientists are particularly interested in the gecko's feet. They want to use the same design on their own robot. The metal robot looks very similar to the gecko. It has four feet which can also walk up walls made of glass or plastic. However, it still has a more difficult time when it tries to walk upside down.

Animals and plants can teach humans a lot about design and engineering. As a result, many engineers, scientists and designers spend time studying them. When they have a problem, nature often has the answer. This science is called biomimetics. Bio- means "studying living things" and mimetics means "copying the movement of things". In other words, scientists – or biomimetics – study animals and plants in order to copy their design.

Take, for example, a whale. Engineers in Canada are studying their flippers because they move so effectively through water. The engineers believe the shape can also improve the movement of wind turbines. Similarly, the boxfish is another animal from the sea which is helping car manufacturers in Germany. Mercedes Benz is using the shape of the fish for one of its new cars. The shape makes it faster and more fuel efficient.

Velcro is probably the most famous example of biomimetics. Most people have some Velcro on an item of clothing. It was invented by the Swiss engineer George de Mestral in 1948. He was walking in the countryside when he pulled a plant's bur from his trousers. He noticed how the bur stuck so well to his clothes. He worked on his idea and the result was Velcro, which became an affordable alternative to the traditional zip.

In 1982, Wilhelm Bartlott was another inventor who had a great idea when he was studying the leaves of a lotus plant. Bartlett noticed that water always ran off the leaf. When he had a closer look, he also noticed how the leaf cleaned itself. Bartlott copied the leaf's special surface and now you can find it in specialised paint products where water and dirt never stay on the paint.

In conclusion, biomimetics has helped to design our world and there are many more future possibilities. Unfortunately, it might take a long time to discover all the possibilities. This isn't really surprising because it's taken nature thousands of years to design its animals and plants.
